GENERAL INFORMATION

OVERVIEW: “Miami Neonatology 2016” strives to provide medical professionals with comprehensive knowledge of the leading trends and best practices in neonatology. This course will highlight the most current concepts in the pathogenesis, management and prevention of problems in the newborn infant. “Miami Neonatology 2016” will provide attendees with an extensive educational program featuring discussion of new developments in treating conditions that are causally associated with morbidity and mortality in the neonate. Important topics will include prenatal conditions that may jeopardize the fetus, management of acute neonatal complications, as well as issues relating to long term developmental outcome.
